





# Pause For Thought 🗓



ere we are in December, and this is the time of the year when most people get busy preparing for Christmas, anticipating yearly traditions and celebrations and some colour in the darkest month of the year.

It's also a busy time for churches because there are a number of additional worship services such as Carol and Christingle services, Midnight Mass, etc. and many extra people who like to attend. However, what I've discovered quite recently is that church attendance is growing all year round!

Some research was carried out by the Bible Society (www.biblesociety.org) across the country. Between 2018 and 2024 attendance (at least once a month) increased by 50%, and the research was given the title "the quiet revival".

The research covers all age groups, and what is noticeable is that the growth is significant, particularly among young adults and those of retirement age. In my own church there are signs of this. They are also expressing interest in finding out more about the Bible.

So what is going on since, generally speaking, church membership and attendance have been in decline since the early 20th century? Is it to do with the Covid pandemic, the state of the world, environmental challenges?

I don't know, but I do know that Jesus is "the reason for the season"! He is the focal point of church worship and the Bible, and would love each one of us to discover that he is our Saviour, and that he is the Saviour of the world.



# Age Concern Hampshire launches Christmas campaign to support older people during winter

Ge Concern Hampshire is launching its annual Christmas campaign, *Past, Present and Future*, to support older people through the challenges of the winter season. This year's campaign shines a spotlight on three key issues that can have a serious impact on later life: winter pressures, falls, and isolation and loneliness. By raising awareness of these challenges, the charity also hopes to generate vital funds and attract new volunteers, helping to secure the longevity of its essential services across the county.

Winter can be a particularly difficult time for older people. Age Concern Hampshire is addressing these winter pressures by helping residents to access essential financial support and providing guidance with form-filling through its Information Service. This includes assistance with benefit applications that can help with heating and fuel costs. By removing these barriers, the charity ensures that older people receive the support they need to stay safe and well during the colder months.

Fall prevention is another crucial focus. Through its Care and Wellbeing Centres and Foot Care clinics, Age Concern Hampshire helps older people maintain mobility, manage foot health and reduce the risk of accidents. These services not only protect physical wellbeing but also contribute to independence and confidence at home.

The campaign also tackles isolation and loneliness, which can intensify during the Christmas season. Support is available at the charity's Care and Wellbeing Centres, or through assistance in the home via the Help at Home service. In addition, practical support and social groups help older people to stay connected, engaged and supported throughout the winter.

Volunteers are central to Age Concern Hampshire's work all year round. From offering companionship to supporting practical services in centres, their dedication ensures that older people in Hampshire receive care, connection and independence. It's a startling fact that more than 2.4 million adults in England can barely read or cannot read at all. Read Easy UK was set up in 2011 to tackle this problem and now has over 80 volunteer-led groups across the country. Since our Basingstoke group formed in 2019, we have enrolled 75 readers onto our free, one-to-one coaching programme, of which 43% successfully graduated or made significant progress. Our reader ambassador has been busy promoting our work through interviews with the BBC and local radio and has also met our local MP. Thanks to her nomination, Basingstoke Read Easy won the Community Project Award at the *A Place to Be Proud Of* event in June 2025. She said, "It took me

two years working with my Read Easy coach and now I no longer feel embarrassed that I have dyslexia and found learning to read difficult."


Feedback shows that improved reading can transform lives.

big thank you to our Patient Participation Group (PPG) members for supporting us with the flu/covid clinics this autumn. Thanks to the dedication of the practice staff, we have been able to offer a comprehensive weekend programme of additional appointments for flu and covid vaccinations alongside our community clinics.

### **Adult Flu and Covid Vaccination Programmes**

If you have not had a flu vaccination, are over 65, or have been invited due to an underlying health condition, please call the practice and book an appointment. The flu vaccination programme will end on the 31 March 2026 (as long as supplies are available), whilst the covid vaccination programme will close on the 31 January 2026.

Covid vaccinations can still be booked through the National Booking Service: https://www.nhs.uk/nhs-services/covid-19-services/covid-19-vaccination-services/book-covid-19-vaccination/ or telephone 119.

### **Child Flu**

Our surgeries continue to vaccinate eligible children who are aged 2-3 yrs or 4-17 yrs with an underlying health condition. Any children who missed their flu vaccination in school will need to contact the School Health Service.

### North Hampshire Prostate Cancer Support Group October Meeting

Antiques - either appreciated (normally by the older generation) or ignored (by the younger)! The group were privileged to have Alan Stone from Squirrel Antiques, who came with two of his team to head up the group's monthly meeting with their lively and fascinating presentation.

Alan started by giving a bit of background and history to the family business, recalling the early days when as a youngster the family converted the old public toilets into the present shop, and his gleeful abandon in the task of knocking the old tiles off the wall. The business has now expanded to three shops, two in Basingstoke and one in Salisbury, with the original being the longest living shop in the town.

He highlighted that they have an increasing role as the town's archivists, with a collection exceeding that of the Willis museum. They typically create their own exhibition a couple of times a year. He added that many of the local charity shops also benefit from the gifting of items which Squirrel have no market for.

Alan introduced his colleague Andrew Wilkinson, who has even appeared on the BBC as an expert on old gramophones.

Now came the fun – a 'Fiona Bruce' type challenge from the Antiques Road Show game. He presented three gramophones and after a brief introduction to each, challenged group members to guess the value, before disclosing their approximate values ranging from about £120 right up to somewhere around £5000. He explained that the winner was unique, as not only were a limited number of that model ever made, but it had been signed by the crews of both the Oxford and Cambridge boats celebrating the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the event's founding.

Andrew went on to highlight that with items such as this, the appeal would have been less to a gramophone collector but would be significantly prized by someone collecting rowing memorabilia. Thus, for an antique dealer the skill is understanding the wider appeal.

Whilst the talk was longer than normal, the Group really appreciated the time spent by Alan and his team especially as it had involved him closing the shop for the afternoon.

We regularly hold public awareness events, encouraging men especially those over 50 to ask for the simple PSA blood test which, whilst not foolproof, is a useful guide to potential issues. At our awareness events we are meeting more who are getting regularly tested.

# Conservation

### Hampshire and Isle of Wight Wildlife Trust Rustles in the leaves

s autumn brings misty mornings and crisp evenings, one of our most familiar garden visitors - the European hedgehog (Erinaceus europaeus) - is preparing for its long winter sleep. These round, brown mammals, famously covered in around 7,000 yellow-tipped spines, are a much-loved feature of Britain's wildlife and an important part of our natural heritage.

Often called the gardener's best friend, hedgehogs are expert nocturnal foragers. They emerge at dusk to snuffle through long grass, flowerbeds, leaf litter and vegetable patches in search of worms, beetles, slugs and other invertebrates, making them natural pest controllers. Hedgehogs have a keen sense of smell

and a remarkable ability to remember the location of abundant food sources.

Mostly active from April to October, they thrive in a variety of habitats, including woodland edges, farmland, parks and suburban gardens, wherever shelter and food are plentiful. Solitary creatures for most of the year, they roam several miles each night in search of food and mates, coming together only during the breeding season in late spring and early summer. # Conservation

By this time of year, hedgehogs are busy feeding as much as possible to build up fat reserves before hibernation begins. As temperatures drop in November, they retreat to sheltered spots such as under sheds, log piles or dense shrubs, creating a nest of leaves and twigs known as a hibernaculum. Inside, their heartbeat slows dramatically and their body temperature drops, allowing them to survive for months without food.

Sadly, the familiar hedgehog is now facing real challenges. Once a common sight in gardens across the UK, numbers have declined sharply over recent decades. Habitat loss, pesticide use and busy roads have all taken their toll, leaving hedgehogs struggling to find safe places to feed and hibernate.

Fortunately, small actions at home can make a big difference. Hampshire & Isle of Wight Wildlife Trust recommends leaving areas of long grass, creating safe corridors between gardens and avoiding harmful chemicals. These all help provide the refuge that hedgehogs need. Every connected green space can become part of a larger, life-saving network for this cherished species. With a bit of care and community effort, we can help ensure hedgehogs remain a welcome part of our gardens for generations.

### Jubiloaks

he regular users of the multi-user path from Oakley to Kempshott will be well aware that, following the fall of a tree over the fence towards the railway, Network Rail asked the landowner, Manydown,

to carry out a safety audit through Long Break to the end of Wells Copse. During October eight trees were mostly monolithed and banded to avoid re-growth - sadly including four oaks.

During the above work our volunteers moved to the Kempshott end of the path to crown-lift walnut trees which have seeded on the field edge and cut back shrubby growth on the edge of the path.

One of the items on our volunteers' work plan for this year, agreed with Basingstoke & Deane Borough Council, was to replace the vandalised seat at Battledown. This led to a second community event to install a second log seat, where so many walkers and cyclists stop for refreshments. The log was donated by Malshanger Estate, prepared and moved to the site by Oakley Men's Shed, with Oakley & Deane Parish Council funding materials - many thanks to everyone involved.

# Oakley Woodlands Group oppicing gives us the

opportunity to notice all sorts of things in the woods. Most recently, while making safe a fallen birch tree, I spotted an enormous hole

in it. When standing, the hole would have been

perhaps three or four metres up the tree. It had clearly been hollowed out, possibly as a roost or nest, although there was no debris such as feathers, down or even moss, which suggests that it had not been inhabited.

Curious to find out more, I turned to Google Lens, an app that searches the internet for information based on a photograph. The answer came back that it was gnawed out by either a porcupine or a beaver. We have a lot of wildlife in Cowdown, including some



rarer species, but we do not host either of these beasties, so I am stumped.

The tree was dead and had clearly broken off some way above the base. We will probably never know what chewed it out, but it does serve as a reminder that it is not only the Woodlands Group that works in the copses. And, talking of working, our work party dates for December are below. Don't forget that the woods are a great place to walk off that Christmas excess, or you could pre-empt it and come and join our work parties.

### **Probus Learn About Local Hero**

atalie Larner gave an outline of Captain John Aiden Liddell VC MC whose 1915 burial in South View cemetery, Basingstoke, was attended by many dignitaries and public crowds.

Although he was born near Newcastle in 1888, during the first world war his family was living at Sherfield Manor which today is Sherfield School.

Captain Liddel had joined the Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders and was responsible for a machine gun section that remained unsupported for 43 days, during which he was wounded. For this action he received the MC.

Before the outbreak of the war, he had trained as a pilot, flying a Boxkite at the Vickers school at Brooklands and following recuperation he joined the Royal Flying Corps and was stationed in northern France/Belgium.

On 31 July 1915 he, together with an observer/gunner, was flying a two-seater RE 5 biplane at 5,000 feet over Bruges when they were fired on by enemy aircraft. Badly wounded, with a shattered right thigh he lost consciousness and the plane dived 3,000 feet before he was able to regain control.

The plane was badly damaged and with the crew member also wounded he managed to fly back to base, saving not only the plane but also the life of his observer. Captain Liddel had his right leg amputated but died a month later. He was 27 years old.

His body was brought back to England where a

Catholic mass was held in London before travelling to Basingstoke where it was met with a full military band and paraded through the town to much public admiration. His observer attended the funeral.

The posthumous VC was presented to his father by the King at Buckingham Palace.

Several commemorative plaques of Captain John Aiden Liddell



VC MC are found around Britain, but two can be found in Sherfield on Loddon, with his name on the village war memorial and on an engraved paving stone atop a brick plinth near to the village cross roads. See probusbasingstoke.club for more information.

Hampshire County Councillor report— Candovers, Oakley and Overton Division Budget Consultation- Have your say

ampshire County Council's budget consultation launched on 4 November and runs until 11:59 pm on Sunday 7 December 2025. This consultation seeks residents' views on how the Council can prepare its budgets up to April 2027, in light of rising costs, increasing demand for services, and continued underfunding by central Government.

Hampshire has a long-standing reputation for managing public money responsibly. Since 2008, the County Council have saved £734 million from the annual budget through early action, efficiency, and innovation. Hampshire has maintained high-performing services and one of the lowest council tax rates among county councils in England.

Despite these efforts, financial pressures, particularly in social care and school transport, continue to grow. These are common to councils nationally – and without fairer funding from Government in these key areas, and for local authorities to have greater flexibility to set Council Tax responsibly in their areas, Hampshire faces a budget shortfall of approximately £143 million in 2026/27, rising to £230 million the following year.

For example:

Each month, 30 older people who were previously paying for their own social care run out of money so we have to step in to cover the costs - adding £18.7 million to the annual bill.

Residential care costs for older people rose by £15 million in the last year.

The number of younger adults requiring complex care packages has risen dramatically and now costs an extra £5.28 million each year.

The number of children with Education, Health and Care Plans to help support their additional needs has grown by 33% since 2022/23.

School transport costs, including for pupils with special educational needs and disabilities, have more than doubled in three years from £43 million to £94 million.

The public consultation invites feedback on a range of options to help balance the budget to 2026/27, including:

- Lobbying Government for funding and legislative change
- Delivering further efficiencies
- Generating additional income
- Reviewing and potentially reducing or stopping some services
- Introducing or increasing charges
- Delaying spend

- Increasing Council Tax
- Using reserves as a short-term measure Residents can participate via the online response form at: www.hants.gov.uk/budgetconsultation

### **County Councillor Grants**

The County Councillor Grant scheme is operating once more, with a lesser amount of £5,000 and new criteria as follows:

- Grants are only available to organisations, not individuals.
- Organisations cannot apply for the same project in consecutive years.
- Applications must demonstrate community benefit, especially if from religious or statutory bodies.
- A maximum of £1,000 per project is now in place.
- Grants for seasonal or time-specific events must be awarded before the event date.
- All funded projects must acknowledge County Council support in promotional materials.
- Previous grant awards (from the last two years) will be considered during evaluation.
- Preference may be given to organisations without access to other funding sources.

These changes aim to ensure the scheme remains fair, transparent and aligned with the Council's strategic priorities while managing financial pressures. To apply please use the following link:

### **Parish Council Bus Shelter Grant Scheme**

Hampshire County Council has launched a new grant scheme to help Parish Councils replace or refurbish bus shelters – making them more attractive, visible and welcoming for passengers. Funded through the Department for Transport's Bus Service Improvement Plan (BSIP) 2025/26 Bus Grant, this scheme is all about improving local infrastructure and encouraging more people to use public transport.

Who can apply? Parish Councils which own and maintain existing bus shelters.

How much is available? Up to £15,000 per shelter site – for either refurbishment or installation of a new shelter at an existing site.

When to apply? Applications are open now and must be submitted by 28 February 2026. Awards will be made on a rolling basis from early 2026.

Parish Councils will need to provide quotes from commercial suppliers as part of their application.

ur first walk in October was on 8<sup>th</sup>, when a group set off from Rooksdown walking through the spinney and across the Tadley Road to reach The Vyne in



### **Local Government Reorganisation Local Government Reorganisation Consultation Now Open**

Many of you will remember that earlier this year several councils submitted proposals to the government about how local government might be reorganised across Hampshire, the Isle of Wight, Portsmouth and Southampton. The government has now opened its formal consultation on these proposals, which will run until 11 January 2026.

The consultation sets out four different unitary models for how services such as highways, planning, waste, social care and education could be delivered in future. At the moment, Hampshire works on a twotier system, with responsibilities shared between Hampshire County Council and the district or borough councils. Parish councils, including ours here in Oakley and Deane, sit alongside this structure and focus on local community matters.

The new proposals would replace the current county and district or borough councils with singletier unitary councils responsible for all the services currently delivered by those two tiers. Parish councils would remain in place, continuing their local role, but would work alongside a single principal authority rather than two.

Although the consultation covers a wide area, the outcome will shape how services are run here in Oakley, Deane and our neighbouring villages for many years to come. Everything from how roads are maintained, to how planning decisions are made, to how community services are supported would sit under whichever new structure is chosen. It is important that residents, parish councils and local groups are aware of what is being proposed and have the chance to respond.




