



During the meeting members of the Council were also keen to hear from the community regarding ideas on how our Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) should be spent. The Council announced its plans to renovate the Beach Park pump track this year, which has been welcomed and has been supported by a local BMX youth group.

Unfortunately, it was also announced that the village has seen a huge increase in litter on our streets/hedgerows and fly tipping in our village waste bins, which is unacceptable. Our two litter wardens work extremely hard all year round in all weather conditions to empty our bins and keep our lovely village clean; please support them and dispose of unwanted waste sensibly and correctly. 
As for the day, itself, there will be music and family entertainment plus food and drink which, with everything else going on, is probably all you need for a good summer afternoon out.


n article entitled In or Out? discussed the Common Market in advance of a vote on **L** continuing membership.

New Local Support Service Launched for Young People

oung people in and around Oakley can now access a brand-new support service, launched by youth charity Step by Step. Thanks to funding from Basingstoke Local Children's Partnership and Sovereign Network Group's Positive Pathways Fund, Step by Step is now offering face-to-face support sessions from The Orchard in Basingstoke-just a short journey from Oakley.

This new service is part of the charity's Launch programme, which provides early intervention and tailored help to young people aged 11 to 25. Whether they're struggling with mental health, housing concerns, or need guidance with education or employment, Launch offers one-to-one and group support designed to build confidence, independence, and brighter futures.

Local schools-including Bishop Challoner Catholic Secondary School and The Costello School-can refer students; any youth group can also refer. The service is also open to self-referrals, meaning any young person or family can get in touch directly.

Debbie Moreton, Chief Executive at Step by Step, said, "This new service enables us to reach more young people earlier, providing the support they need before problems become crises."

The Launch team is now delivering group sessions

on topics like self-esteem, wellbeing, and employability, and offers vital support for care leavers and unaccompanied asylum-seeking children, who often face extra challenges without strong support networks.

Step by Step is encouraging local residents, businesses, and community groups in Oakley to help spread the word. If you know a young person who could benefit-or if you'd like to support the service-you can find out more at stepbystep.org.uk/basing-heroes.







Oakley Woodlands Group owdown and St John's

copses are thought to be ancient woodland, but what does that

mean and how do we know? Ancient woodland are areas that have been continuously wooded since at least 1600, which is when the maps began to have some level of accuracy. It does not mean that the trees are 400 years old, just that there have been trees there all that time. In our woods the main trees are oak and hazel, although several other species can also be found. The oaks are about 150 to 200 years old and were probably planted as a crop as the copses were commercially worked into the 1960s. Indeed, at that time St John's was three times the size it is now.

In the absence of records, there are indications of the ancient status of woods, in the form of the flowers found there. These indicator species are usually plants that spread slowly, thus their presence in large numbers suggests they have had a long residency. Bluebells are one of these markers and, by the time you read this, there should be a good show in both copses, but especially Cowdown. Another is the wood anemone, a small white flower which is currently carpeting St John's. Other species include primrose and dog's mercury, which are well established in both



woods. This is a great time to take a walk on the wood side, to misquote Lou Reed. Just remember the

The vanishing call of Britain's lapwing

Spring in the British countryside once echoed with the distinctive, trilling call of the northern lapwing (*Vanellus Vanellus*), a striking blackand-white bird with a shimmering green back and a wispy crest. Also known as the peewit - after its haunting call - lapwings were once a common sight, but today their numbers are in serious decline.

Lapwings are an unmistakable part of the UK's natural heritage. Their dramatic, tumbling flight displays in early spring are a spectacle, as males perform acrobatic dives to impress potential mates. But while they may be bold in the air, they are incredibly vulnerable on the ground.

As ground-nesting birds, lapwings lay their wellcamouflaged eggs in simple scrapes in mud or sand, on short grassland and arable land. This makes them highly susceptible to disturbance from people, livestock, and, crucially, off-lead dogs. A single frightened bird taking flight may not seem particularly noticeable but, if lapwings are repeatedly disturbed, they abandon their nests - leaving eggs or chicks exposed to predators and the elements.

Habitat loss has already pushed lapwing numbers into steep decline. Since 1967, the UK population has decreased by 55 per cent, earning them Red List status as a species of conservation concern. Loss of





mixed farming, spring coppicing and the intensification of grassland management have all contributed to their struggles.

Many nature reserves managed by Hampshire & Isle of Wight Wildlife Trust provide nesting areas for various species of ground nesting birds, including Testwood Lakes Nature Reserve, near Southampton, which is home to breeding lapwings.

As a nation of dog lovers, we all want to enjoy the great outdoors with our furry companions. But we must also remember that we share these spaces with wildlife that depends on them for survival.

One of the biggest challenges is how difficult these nests can be to spot, even for trained eyes, in open locations where you would expect to see them. Their natural camouflage makes them blend seamlessly into their surroundings, increasing the risk of accidental disturbance.

By keeping dogs close by and under control during the ground-nesting bird season, which lasts from now

until late summer, we can help protect vulnerable birds and other species. Small changes in our behaviour can make a big difference, ensuring that future generations can continue to enjoy the sights and sounds of nature in our beautiful landscapes. Probus Club Hear About HMS Broadsword in the Falklands War

harlie Threlfall was a 19-year-old Sub Lieutenant in the Royal Navy aboard HMS Broadsword, then the latest design of Type 22 frigate, during the Falklands War in 1982. He detailed the ship's mission, and the challenges faced in the conflict.

Initially HMS Broadsword was set for a goodwill tour of ten countries but, following the invasion of the Falklands Islands by Argentina on 2 April 1982, they the sinking of six British war ships. Sixteen other war ships suffered damage.

They had been positioned in San Carlos Water where they were attacked by fast jets coming across country and were sent out to sea with HMS Coventry, which was struck with three 500lb bombs. Broadsword rescued 170 sailors. They narrowly escaped destruction themselves when a 1000lb bomb struck their vessel 10 feet above the water line, travelled upwards before emerging through the flight deck, where it took off the nose of a Lynx helicopter,

and bounced overboard without exploding.

HMS Broadsword was a guided missile frigate, with a displacement of 4,500 tons and with a crew of 235 but did not have traditional gun batteries. The latest thinking of naval warfare was that guided missiles were the future: they could be locked on a target without fail. It was discovered that the four launchers of the Exocet missiles carried by HMS Broadsword could not be reloaded at sea. There were other lessons learned through this conflict that ware


through this conflict that were ultimately incorporated into naval practice. Having the correct missiles and numerous life-

sailed from Gibraltar on 5 April, to the South Atlantic joining a fleet to confront the invaders.

The crew endured long hours with little sleep during the conflict and faced attacks that resulted in threatening experiences ultimately enhanced sailors' safety.

Covid Vaccine Programme

The NHS national booking system is open for spring Covid-19 vaccination bookings, for those eligible, who can book appointments until 17 June 2025. Eligibility for a spring vaccination is similar to previous years but those with a weakened immune system are now eligible from 6 months instead of 5 years.

Following JCVI (Joint Council on Vaccination and Immunisation) advice, this spring's eligible cohorts include:

- Adults aged 75 years and over by 30 June 2025 .
- Residents in care homes for older adults
- Individuals aged 6 months and over who are immunosuppressed

Anyone eligible can book a vaccine appointment via the NHS.UK website or by calling 119 for free, with parents or carers able to book a Covid-19 vaccination for children under 16 on their behalf. Eligible people aged 16 and over can also use the NHS App to book an appointment.

This year there are thousands of appointments available every day across the country including at pharmacies and GP practices. Some areas also offer convenient walk-in options, with a list of available walk-in sites online. nhs.uk/nhs-services/vaccinationand-booking-services/find-a-walk-in-covid-19vaccination-site

We often get asked why we invite patients who

have previously declined. The NHS England 'rules' do not allow us to permanently decline a patient from a vaccination programme as patients may change their minds at a future point. When we can we do allow patients to decline from the invitation sent.

Following the successful trial of a Health Kiosk at Overton Surgery, we have been successful in getting funding for a second at Kingsclere. All patients with a current registration at Watership Down Health are welcome to use either of our Health Kiosks.


The Health Kiosk is available from 8 am in the morning to 6:20 pm at night (to allow the checks and information to be transferred into the clinic system) and is situated in the waiting rooms at Kingsclere and Overton. The Health Kiosk will record a range of information including height, weight, blood pressure as well as a number of Health Questionnaires being included.

Their experiences had shown them that, while freedom has to be fought for, only in peace can such dreams be realised. 
