

It's Panto time! Well, nearly! And what better way to start the Christmas season in Oakley than


with a home-bred hot-off-the press panto from TOPS

Meanwhile, these existing glasses had to suit. "But what about navigating stairs?" Marian asked. "Just take them off," she was told. Doh!

NHS App Notifications

e have been asked by NHS England to ask patients to switch on Notifications on their NHS App so that they receive notifications. To enable notifications in the NHS App, open the app, navigate to "More," then "Account and settings," and finally "Manage notifications." Toggle on the option to "Send me notifications about new messages." Ensure notifications are also enabled in your device's settings.

NHS Cervical Screening Programme results

From September 2025, the NHS plans to start sending digital results from the NHS Cervical Screening Programme, utilising the NHS App. In September 2025, those who have a negative test result will be notified of this by an NHS App message. It will also appear as an NHS App notification. If the NHS App message isn't read within 72 hours, a letter will be sent as a failsafe.

Abnormal result letters will continue, for the time being, to be sent by post. This change follows the successful rollout of digital invitations and reminders in June 2025. Since the launch, nine out of every 10 invitations are being sent digitally, with the remainder being sent by post.

As the abnormal results and failsafe letters are still being sent by post it is very important that the practice be advised of a change of address as soon as possible. This includes patients who move both within and outside the practice boundary as it is vital that these letters reach you. Equally important, notice is needed for patients who move overseas for more than three months. We cannot reiterate too much how important it is for the practice to have a current address and contact details to help you better manage your health.



1.2 billion people need glasses to see better World Sight Day, now in its 13th consecutive year, comes once again to a stand in Central Square, Basingstoke - between Primark and Costa - on Thursday, 9 October, courtesy of The Basingstoke Lions Club and featuring a collection point for redundant spectacles of any description, together with a display of information regarding sight loss and small items of equipment to help the visually impaired with some of the practical aspects of daily living.

The unwanted spectacles find new life in some form, e.g. "gold" rims melted down and vintage/ designer pairs sold on. The remainder are then sent to Medico France in Le Havre where they are cleaned and graded, ready for use in eye camps in Africa, India and Eastern Europe.

In addition, a spectacle collection point will be available in Morrisons Supermarket from Monday 6 to Sunday 12 October, for those who might find that more convenient.

ctober is the time of year when the leaves start to fall, which allows the evergreen species in the woods to really stand out. One that can be contentious is ivy (Hedera helix). There is a thought that this climber

is harmful to trees, but this is not really correct. Ivy is not a parasite, and does not draw any nutrient from the trees. It has its own root system, and the hairy stem allows it to grip onto surfaces, allowing it to climb. It is not, however, totally without problems. During winter storms the ivy leaves can catch the wind and this combined with the extra weight can bring down a tree branch or even the whole tree.

Ivy is beneficial to the ecosystem of the woods as it supports wildlife providing both shelter and food. It is one of the latest flowering species which is especially important to insects as a late nectar source. This is important for bees as they stock up for winter. The berries are high in fat and are attractive to many species of birds including thrushes, blackcaps, woodpigeons and blackbirds. Overall then, ivy is good, it just needs to be managed. The ancient Greeks and Romans believed that wearing a wreath of ivy around on the head would prevent drunkenness. Perhaps not something to recommend!

Probus Club hears about the 1961 Portland Russian spy ring

he 1961 Russian spy ring in England involved several individuals who passed sensitive information to the Soviet Union during the Cold War, leading to a significant MI5 operation and trial. The spies operated undercover identities, using sophisticated methods such as microdots hidden in antique books and advanced radio transmissions to communicate classified data.

The spies included American communists Lona and Morris Cohen posing as Helen and Peter Kroger, and Konon Molody as Gordon Lonsdale, with Harry Houghton recruited due to financial pressures and personal relationship with Ethel Gee, all operating amid Cold War tensions and nuclear research at the Admiralty Underwater Weapons Establishment in Portland, Dorset.

MI5 coordinated the arrests in January 1961, followed by a secret trial at the Old Bailey in March, while maintaining much of the case's details confidential.

Ethel Gee provided plans for Harry Houghton to pass to Gordon Lonsdale who reduced them to microdots. They were hidden in antique books sent by Peter Kroger to addresses in the Eastern Bloc. Helen Kroger operated a radio transmitter that enabled quick communication, which MI5 tracked to a bungalow in Ruislip, possibly using a secret aircraft prepared by speaker and Probus member, David Stiles.

Gordon Lonsdale, Helen and Peter Kroger, Harry Houghton, and Ethel Gee received prison sentences ranging from 25 to 15 years, with some later exchanged in spy swaps and honoured as heroes of the Soviet Union in Russia.

More autistic adults in Basingstoke to benefit from social groups thanks to council grant

hanks to a new grant awarded to Autism
Hampshire, more autistic adults in Basingstoke
will be able to access vital social support. The
leading local autism charity has received a grant of
nearly £14,000 from Basingstoke and Deane Borough
Council's Strengthening Communities Grant Scheme.
This will go towards expanding its Serendipity
Community Groups - creating new spaces where
autistic adults can connect, build friendships, and feel
part of their community. The Strengthening
Communities Grant Scheme supports local
community and voluntary sector organisations to
build capacity and sustainability.

Autism Hampshire's social groups offer a safe, welcoming space for autistic adults to build connections, and combat social isolation. We are a not-for-profit charitable social enterprise who provide the Hampshire County Council's meals on wheels service, delivering hot meals across Hampshire, 365 days a year.

All our meals are nutritionally balanced, and we offer a wide range of delicious and nutritious hot meals and desserts. Our menus include meals that are low in fat, salt, allergen-free, or reduced sugars. We provide Kosher, Asian, Halal, and West Indian food, and can also provide Pureed, Minced & Moist, and Soft & Bite-sized food for people following special diets.

The meals are delivered hot and ready to eat by our Community Team Members who are all DBS checked. Every visit includes delivery of a hot meal and dessert, along with a caring wellbeing check. Our Community Team Members will happily plate your meal up, fetch your cutlery, and offer you a glass of water.

Meals are delivered between 11:15 am and 2:15 pm, and you will usually receive your meal at a similar time every day. You can order meals as a one-off, temporarily, or for as long as you would like them.

Alongside your hot meal you can also order a Tea Pack which includes a sandwich or cream tea, dessert and a snack. These are delivered at the same time as your hot lunch time meal and are placed in your refrigerator to enjoy later.

During the winter months it is important to keep yourself well and so try and keep moving as much as you can to help increase your body temperature whilst boosting your health with micronutrients such as Vitamins C, B6 and E, Zinc and Magnesium. Hydration is also key and so hydrate with plenty or water rich beverages like a mug of hot chocolate, or a warm soup or stew.

Local government reorganisation

Pollowing public and stakeholder engagement held this summer, the full County Council will meet on 24 September to consider final

proposals for Local Government Reorganisation (LGR). The Cabinet is expected to confirm the final proposal on 26 September, before it is submitted to Government.

The Government has asked councils across England to replace the current two-tier system, where county and district councils deliver separate council services and, instead, create unitary councils that deliver all local services. For Hampshire and the Solent area, this would see the County Council, 11 district councils, and the unitary councils of Southampton, Portsmouth and the Isle of Wight replaced with fewer local authorities.

Hampshire's current proposal, developed in partnership with East Hampshire District Council, recommends creating four new unitary councils: three on the Hampshire and Solent mainland and one for the Isle of Wight. This model is designed to be simpler, stronger and more secure, with local identity and community voice at its heart.

Councillor Nick Adams-King, Leader of Hampshire County Council, said, "We're approaching a key moment in shaping a better future for local government in Hampshire and the Solent.

"I want to thank everyone who took part in our summer engagement. Your feedback is helping to shape a proposal that County Councillors will be considering very soon, before our final choice is submitted to Government later this month. It will then be for Government to decide on which options they formally consult the public - anticipated to be before the end of the year.

"In the meantime, our aim is clear: to protect and improve the vital services people rely on, ensure councils are financially strong for the future, and responsive to local needs. By creating councils that are large enough to be efficient, but local enough to stay connected to communities, we can give people a stronger voice in how their area is run. This is about securing a better future for Hampshire and the Solent."

The LGR proposal is backed by independent analysis and Hampshire's longstanding track record of delivering high-quality services - from Ofsted-rated 'Outstanding' Children's Services to nationally recognised infrastructure and adult care programmes. Over the years, Hampshire has also supported other councils to help them keep their essential services running – most recently helping Isle of Wight Council with the provision of their Children's Services and

Public Health. This solid experience and commitment to public service are guiding the County Council's approach to reform.

Findings from this summer's engagement show strong public understanding of the issues around LGR. A total of around 5,000 people and organisations fed back to the County Council via its survey as well as wider engagement activity, with many recognising the potential benefits of reducing 15 councils to four, alongside the potential for better access to services, cost savings, and stronger local identity and representation.

Hampshire County Council already delivers 85% of all council services to 1.4 million residents, including children's and adults' social care, highways, and education. The current proposed model builds on this foundation, aiming to:

Deliver better value for money

Strengthen local leadership

Bring services closer to communities

Save around £50 million each year, helping protect frontline services to those most in need and ensure long-term financial sustainability

Unlock the area's potential to innovate and grow the local economy

Once the County Council's preferred option for LGR across Hampshire and the Solent area is submitted on 26 September, the Government is expected to consult the public later this year, with a final decision due in spring 2026.



Extra HCC Report Hampshire Faces Major Funding Cuts Under Government's 'Fair' Funding Review

I mentioned previously the risk to Hampshire from the Government's review of local government funding. Essentially this takes money from rural areas in the South and passes it to urban councils, particularly those in the North and Midlands. Hampshire County Council has now responded to the Government's Fair Funding Review 2.0—and we're sounding the alarm. The proposed changes to how councils are funded could leave Hampshire significantly worse off, with many councils across the county facing real-terms cuts.

What's happening? The new formula underestimates Hampshire's needs and overestimates how much we can raise through council tax. It risks deepening our financial deficit and reducing vital services. Why it matters: without urgent changes, Hampshire's

councils could struggle to deliver essential services-

especially for vulnerable residents.
